

IT'S NOT WHAT YOU KNOW BUT WHO YOU KNOW

If the Rapture occurred at the very moment a church was conducting Sunday morning worship, those watching on live stream would see most of the congregation suddenly vanish, but a few people would be left behind. Those remaining would look around trying to make sense of what just happened. Where did everyone go?

We must never assume everyone who goes to church really knows Jesus Christ as their personal Savior and Lord. Many are cultural Christians; they have Christian habits, perhaps had a Christian upbringing, and even a lot of biblical knowledge, but they do not really know Christ.

Today, we tend to believe that knowledge is most important, not relationships. With technology, we can find almost any fact on line. Concerning the Bible, study resources are more abundant and available than ever. We are apt to forget that it's not *what we know* that is most important; it's *who we know*.

Jesus warns us, "Not everyone who says to Me, 'Lord, Lord,' shall enter the kingdom of heaven, but he who does the will of My Father in heaven. Many will say to Me on that day, 'Lord, have we not prophesied in Your name, cast out demons in Your name, and done many wonders in Your name?' And then I will declare to them, "I never knew you." (Matthew 7:21-23)

This is frightening. Jesus will say, in effect, "we did not have a personal relationship. You may have been very busy doing religious things, but you never received Me as your personal Savior."

1 John 5:11-12 says, "And this is the testimony: that God has given us eternal life, and this life is in His Son. He who has the Son has life; he who does not have the Son of God does not have life."

You and I must make sure we know Jesus Christ personally through salvation. We must make Him know to others by sharing our faith. It's a simple theme, but more important than we can imagine - **to know Him and to make Him known!** Our entire Christian experience is summed up in those words!

ANSWERS TO QUESTIONS ABOUT PRAYER

In our February Newsletter, we began a study on prayer based on an article, "Answers to Questions About Prayer" by David Jeremiah.

Last month we looked at prayer being a powerful tool that provides an immediate connection to our heavenly Father. However, it is often misused or misunderstood. This month we look at...

What is the Correct Way to Pray to God?

That may seem like a simple question, but even the apostles asked Jesus how to pray. Prayer is a conversation that becomes easier with frequency, just as a conversation with a new friend becomes easier over time. But Jesus did illustrate that we are to pray to the Father, not to the Son.

The Father is the ultimate Authority, while Jesus is our Mediator. Jesus always encourages us to go to the Father, submit our will to Him, and approach Him with reverence and awe. The ultimate example is the "Lord's Prayer" or "Disciples Prayer" found in Matthew 6.

We often forget about the importance of simplicity in our prayers. We don't need to use grand figures of speech to express ourselves, for Christ tells us the Lord already knows what we need before we ask (Matthew 6:8.) This promise is His comfort to us.
