



Most of my guests like to prepare their own food. Here are my recommendations for general food shopping:

Econo Foods has a good produce section and also has some organic foods - probably the best selection of everything anywhere. It is on M-26 in Houghton at a stop light intersection with a Pizza Hut on the East side and a Culvers, Econo Foods and Shopko on the west side. Past that intersection on M-26 is a super Walmart. Jim's Foodmart which is very close to MTU (1+ block) - just behind the Wells Fargo branch bank has a nice selection of ethnic foods..

There is a natural foods co-op in Hancock - the Keweenaw Co-op - but it's off the beaten track. You go across the bridge into Hancock (one-way traffic) and keep on US41. You'll go thru a strong right turn a few blocks after after the main business section and the Citgo Station into 2 way traffic. As you climb the hill, there is an almost hairpin turn to the right again with a tire shop and then a fire hall back on the left side. You turn left at that curve to go towards the fire hall (Ethel Ave). The co-op is about 2-3 blocks down on the right at the stop sign. They are in a small old neighborhood grocery store.

Pat's Foods and festival Foods are also good. Festival is off the map past the Walmart about 1/2 mile.
