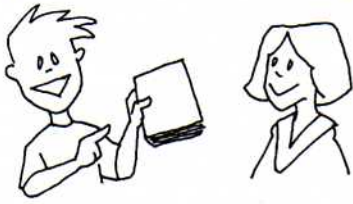
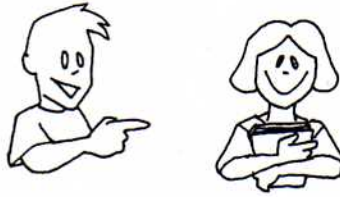


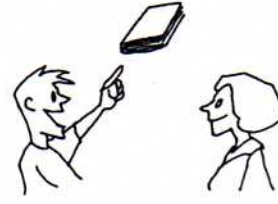

Used to address persons of equal or lower status. Japanese people use names or titles to address persons of higher status. Whenever possible, avoid the use of あなた ANATA especially when it is clear that the subject is "you."
