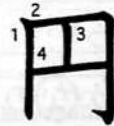

Japanese Currency

Japanese currency consists of coins: one yen, five yen, ten yen, fifty yen, a hundred yen and five hundred yen. Unlike the U.S., Japan does not have units of 25. Bills are available in 1,000 yen, 5,000 yen and 10,000 yen denominations. The value of the currency is clearly indicated on the coin or bill. Also, coins and bills graduate in size from small to large according to their value. Japanese bills are difficult to counterfeit. If one holds a Japanese bill to the light, one is able to see an image in the
