Once again, we are in the midst of the Lenten Season. Lent can be thought of as a "wilderness time"; Lent reminds us that Jesus spent 40 days in the wilderness in deep reflection and prayer. But please, give them with love and appreciation, knowing that these lay leaders are working hard and in good faith to guide the congregation at this time, consulting with outside help (e.g., the District and UUA) along the way.

John F. Kennedy famously said, "We all inhabit this small planet. We all breathe the same air. We all cherish our children's future. And we are all mortal." In this vast cosmos, we really have *each other* and our profound connectedness and interdependence. Let us be especially loving with one another in this time of transition and uncertainty; let us really *be there* for each other.

I will close with words of George E. Odell, found in our hymnal:

We need one another when we mourn and would be comforted. We need one another when we are in trouble and afraid. We need one another when we are in despair, in temptation, and need to be recalled to our best selves again. We need one another when we would accomplish some great purpose, and cannot do it alone. We need one another in the hour of success, when we look for someone to share our triumphs. We need one another in the hour of defeat, when with encouragement we might endure, and stand again. We need one another when we come to die, and would have gentle hands prepare us for the journey. All our lives we are in need, and others are in need of us.

Blessed are we that we need each other.
