Dearest Ones,

Over these last ten months, we have laughed together and we have cried together. We have celebrated together and we have grieved together. All the while, the people of this place, this congregation, this town have attached themselves ever more firmly to my heart.

This past year has not been the easiest of years. The congregation has lost three members who dedicated much of their lives to the good of this beautiful church on the Common: Ledlie Woolsey, Rev. Arthur Perkins, and Doris Coolidge. The losses among your extended friends, family, and town have only added to the grief experienced over the past year.

This year has also been a year filled with hope: hope for a new ministry, hope for new life, hope for a healthier congregation. You have told the stories of the past in groups small and large, you have started to work through some important questions, and you have begun to heal. Just a month ago, you held a special congregational meeting at which differing opinions were expressed, good process was followed, and new options were found. When I first arrived several months ago, many of you expressed disbelief that a congregation could ever agree on calling a new minister with a 90% vote or more. Some of you wondered if that number should be lowered. Yet, just a month ago, you voted overwhelmingly in favor or renewing your developmental minister's contract. I want to be clear – this is NOT about me, this is about you and the work you have done to get to this place. It may not feel like a lot, it may not feel like enough, but I am absolutely certain that you are now a healthier congregation than when I first arrived.

There is more to be done, of course, but for now we can pause and celebrate once again: the joy of being able to speak more openly and safely, the joy of seeing children present at Social Hour on Sunday morning, the joy of worshipping together and caring for one another day after day.

On Tuesday evening, June 12th at 6:30 pm in the Sanctuary, I will share my year's-end developmental minister's report. I hope you will be there.
