


The Pastor's Letter

Synod Assembly 2013 - Hilton Hotel East Brunswick

This year's synod assembly was perhaps one of the most significant in the history of the New Jersey Synod. A new bishop was to be elected with the retirement of our current bishop, Bishop E. Roy Riley, after 22 years of service.

The election process dominated the three day assembly. For such an election there needed to be an officer from the national church to preside over it. That person was David D. Swartling, Secretary, Evangelical Lutheran Church in America. There can be, and were in this case five ballots cast for bishop. The winner had to have a certain percentage for election, with the winning percentage declining with each new ballot. So as you can well imagine the winning percentage for the first ballot was quite high. The first ballot was open to any rostered (clergy) person in the synod or ELCA. There were many candidates on the ballot, and many had

only one vote. Needless to say many of these dropped out leaving fewer, with the field narrowing on each succeeding ballot. On Saturday morning there was no election on the fourth ballot, which left only two candidates. The final fifth ballot with the two candidates required only a simple majority of the voting members of the assembly. At this point, it would be good to summarize the results with an e-mail from the ELCA that reported on the election:

CHICAGO (ELCA) -- The Rev. Tracie L. Bartholomew, Lawrenceville, N.J., was elected June 8 to a six-year term as bishop of the New Jersey Synod of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America (ELCA). Bartholomew was elected on the fifth ballot during the synod's assembly June 6-8 in East Brunswick, N.J.

"I ask for prayers for me and for our congregations as we transition into this new chapter in our synod. I can't wait to see what new adventures lie ahead," said Bartholomew.

Bartholomew was elected with 232 votes to 204 votes for the Rev. Scott C. Schantzenbach, assistant to the bishop of the ELCA New Jersey Synod. The Rev. Michael C. Gebhart, pastor of St. Michael Lutheran in Cherry Hill, N.J., was also a nominee on the fourth ballot with 131 votes to 145 for Bartholomew and 160 for Schantzenbach.

Bartholomew has served as assistant to the bishop in the ELCA New Jersey Synod since 1998. She was pastor of Abiding Presence Lutheran Church in Ewing, N.J., from 1993 to 1998, pastor of Good Shepherd Lutheran Church in Lexington Va., from 1991 to 1993, and associate pastor of St. Mark Lutheran Church in Roanoke, Va., from 1989 to 1991.

The bishop-elect earned a Bachelor of Science degree in political science from James Madison University in Harrisonburg, Va., in 1985, and a Master of Divinity degree from Lutheran Theological Southern Seminary in 1989. The seminary is one of eight ELCA seminaries.

Bartholomew will be installed Sept. 29. She is married to the Rev. Dan Whitener, who serves at Abiding Presence in Ewing, N.J. They have two children.

> There also was an election held for members throughout the synod to synod council, as well as a preliminary budget for 2014. Budgeting for the synod is done in a two year cycle. Reports were given from various organizations related to the synod, and there were installation and sending rites for various folk and groups doing different mission tasks in the name of the synod. Finally, various resolutions on the issues of our day were voted on. Information about them can be found the New Jersey Synod website http://www.njsynod.org

A personal comment here: I have been attending various assemblies such as these for three denominations in my almost thirty years of ordained ministry. Resolutions are almost always brought up, and when passed have very little impact outside of those in the assembly. I understand the need to speak up, debate, and speak out on the various issues of our time. While I don't profess to have the answer here, I still wonder if there is a better way, a more meaningful way to do this.

For me this was a "once in a lifetime assembly" because of the historic "changing of the guard" in the New Jersey Synod. I want to thank you for being able to attend and to thank Ralph Avard who came faithfully each day to be a voting member from St. James.

The Lutheran Church in the Civil War South

With all the attention these days on the 150^{th} anniversary of the Civil War, it would be interesting to examine how the Lutheran churches in the Confederacy dealt with the situation.

The General Synod of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in the Confederate States of America was formed in 1863 for synods in the states that had seceded from the Union. Several existing synods were affected by secessions, and other synods were added later.

In 1866, after the war, the General Synod in the CSA took the name United Synod of the South and began publishing the Lutheran Visitor.


Senior League Notes - "Fellowship over Fifty"
