

"IN FLA., IT WAS ROOT FOR SANTA'S TEAM OR ELSE" By The Associated Press

JACKSONVILLE, Fla. - A less-than-jolly Santa Claus at a mail told a 6-year-old boy he wouldn't get any presents if he was a University of Florida football fan.

Santa also pointed his white-gloved finger at the boy's father and challenged him to a fight. Santa then walked off the job, leaving expectant children stunned.

Chip Crabtree said he and his wife took their sons - ages 2,4, and 6 - to The Avenues mall on Friday.

When Santa saw the children's mother, Lori, wearing a University of Florida Gators sweatshirt, he said: "Santa Claus doesn't like Gator fans... Santa Claus wishes that Florida State would beat the Gators in the Sugar Bowl, " according to Crabtree.

When the children's mother told Santa he was being rude, the red-faced chief elf retorted: "Lady, if you don't like it, you can get them (the children) off my lap," Crabtree recounted.

The family asked for their money back and began to leave. Crabtree, who was videotaping the visit from 10 feet away, told Santa he didn't like his remarks.

That's when Santa jumped from his chair and allegedly thumped Crabtree's chest with his finger and taunted: "You want to do something about it, right now, pal? Right here on stage?" according to Crabtree. Crabtree said he didn't.

When mall security jumped in, Santa told a nearby elf. "Just tell them (the children) to go home. I'm out of here," Crabtree recounted.

Mall general manager Tom Funari apologized.

"Santas are trained that they are supposed to be impartial," he explained. He didn't know the Santa's real

The Santa operation is run by Suncoast Photography, not the mall. Tom Lane, co-owner of Suncoast, also said he didn't know the name of the grumpy Santa.

Crabtree later told his children that this wasn't the real Santa.

"Sometimes, Santa uses helpers, and this one was an impostor," he said.

Crabtree's 6-year-old said that he knew it wasn't Santa, because "there wasn't any magic in his eyes,"

PRAYER IN PUBLIC SCHOOLS? (part 1 of 2) by Matt Headley

INTRODUCTION

Many of you have gone to a Christian School all of your life, but there are some of us who go to a public school and know all about the pressure and influence that is put upon us sometimes by so many unsaved students. I have had some experience of being in both Christian and public schools.

Those of us who have had experience going to public school know how important prayer in school could be, but also realize how hard it would be for such a diverse public.

Public school prayer has been a hot topic in the news recently, and I thought I should include some of it in the newsletter. I will divide this topic up into 2 parts. Part 1 includes this introduction, a summary of news articles, and some opinions about this very controversial topic. Part 2, which will be in next month's issue, will have an article written by a news columnist that has a very important message.

WHAT'S GOING ON?

Newt Ginrich, the Georgia Republican congressman who has become the House speaker, has called for hearings and a House vote by July 4 on a school prayer amendment to the Constitution. He has said the amendment will allow "voluntary prayer" in schools.

The Supreme Court ruled in 1962 that organized prayer in public schools violated the First Amendment's separation of church and state. For years Republicans, backed by the religious right, have sought to reintroduce voluntary prayer in schools. Many Catholic, Protestant and Jewish groups have supported the 1962 ruling and subsequent Supreme Court church-state decisions that followed it.

Brent Walker of the Baptist Joint Committee says, "We are not opposed to prayer, It is precisely because we believe so fervently in prayer that we do not want the government to meddle in it."

Before the 1962 ruling, schools across the nation featured prayers to start each day, recitations of the Lord's Prayer before all assemblies, and use of state-written prayers.


In order for Constitutional amendments to pass, they must be approved by a two-third majority of the House and Senate, and then ratified by three-fourths of the states. The president cannot veto them.

OPINIONS

- The Clinton administration is leaning toward legislation allowing a moment of silence in schools. "The president has long supported this moment of silence, and I think its something he will look at seriously," said Joel Klein, deputy White House counsel.
- Attorney General Janet Reno said that any effort to return organized prayer to public schools "must protect the religious freedom of the many different faiths in this country."
- Four Republican governors, William Weld of Massachusetts, Christine Todd Whitman of New Jersey, Tommy Thompson of Wisconsin and Pete Wilson of California - said they had no objection to a moment of silence before starting the school day, and were not necessarily opposed to legislation or a constitutional amendment as long as prayer was voluntary.
- Ralph Reed, president of the conservative Christian Coalition, said on CBS that the government had "taken the phrase 'freedom of religion' and turned it into 'freedom from religion'".
- Forest Montgomery of the National Association of Evangelicals said a constitutional amendment "may or may not be the best way to address a basic problem in our society - public schools have been sanitized of all mention of God and our nation's religious heritage. There could be a statutory solution, or perhaps some other better way."
