

## Questionnaire Results







There is no part of life that does not contain its lessons: if you are alive, there are lessons to be learned.


6. "There" is no better than "here."


In other news, Sixers' coach,

## COURTHOUSE LAWN DECKED WITH CHRISTMAS TOOTHBRUSHES

LEXINGTON, Va. (AP) - Someone decorated the Rockbridge County Courthouse's lawn with 53 red-handled toothbrushes, stuck in the grass in two rows: uniformly spaced, bristles facing out.

"There's a lot of wacky things that happen in this town, but this has to be on the top of the wacky list. Just for sheer oddness. And mystery," Doug Harwood, editor of the monthly magazine Rockbridge Advocate, said Wednesday.

"The magazine often chronicles strange happenings in Lexington, home to two colleges with storied histories of mischief: Virginia Military Institute and Washington and Lee College.

Harwood said people have been going out to look at the toothbrushes since they were discovered Tuesday: "But once we get there, it's kinda like looking at the cows. What can you say? 'Sure is a fine crop o' toothbrushes you got there, Homer. Think they're about ready for harvesting?"


