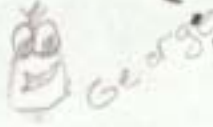

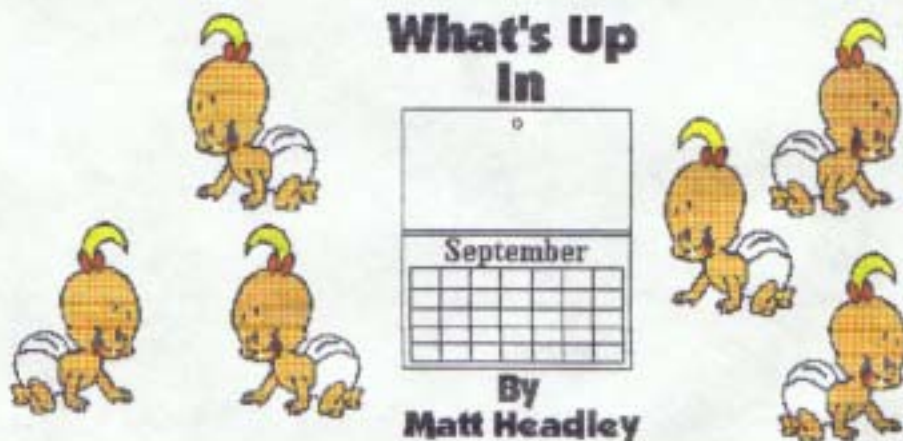


As most of you know, I am a big Flyers Fan, and I would like to inform you that the hockey season will be starting up again soon.

COURTNEY: GETTING CHAPERONES

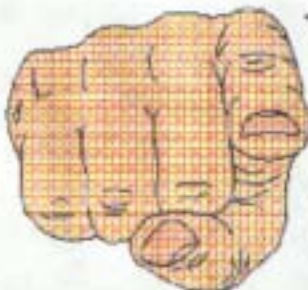
After that, we discussed things like:

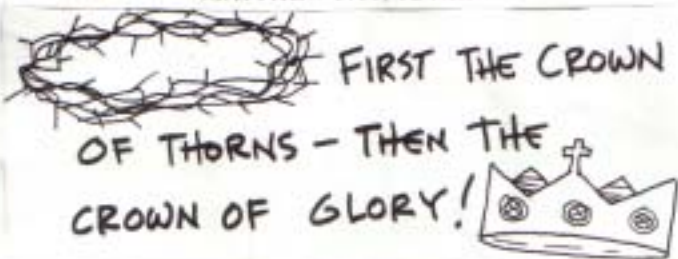
