## GABRIEL STELLE

BORN IN NEW YORK, FEBRUARY 2, 1685, SON OF PONCET STELLE (DE L'ESTOILE) AND HIS WIFE EUGENIE LEGEREAU

DIED IN PERTH AMBOY, NEW JERSEY, NOVEMBER 25, 1738; INTERRED IN THE OLD PRESBYTERIAN GRAVEYARD IN PERTH AMBOY; REINTERRED IN 1872 IN THE ALPINE CEMETERY IN PERTH AMBOY

"Married three times, he was active in civic affairs, serving as a Judge of the Quorum and as a Vestryman for St. Peter's Church"



HIS SECOND WIFE WAS ANNA - (1686-1730)



## GABRIEL STEELE WAS A SLAVEHOLDER. WHILE LIVING IN SHREWSBURY, NEW JERSEY, HE PUBLISHED THIS NOTICE IN THE AMERICAN WEEKLY MERCURY OF PHILADELPHIA ON AUGUST 1, 1723:

"Runaway about the 15th of June Last, from Gabriel Stelle of Shrewsbury, an Negro Man named Jack, of small stature, he had on an Osenbrigs shirt and a woolen shirt, a pair of Leather Breeches, a dark homespun Jacket, a dark Cloase bodied fashionable Coat with a brown Kersey Great-Coat, an Old Beaver hat, a pair of square toed shoes with wooden heels, he is a Madagascar Negro. Whoever takes up the said Negro and brings him to his said Master or to Issac Stelle in Allens Town, shall have two Pistoles as a Reward besides Reasonable Charges."
