On page 194 of the October 1993, issue of The Perfins Bulletin there was an article on pattern M242-253 by Doug Cutler.

The ten device perforator is in my possession. I purchased it years ago from the MSU salvage department. The changing of the device was done by the maintenance shop not by students.

The C was drilled in an attempt to make a complete circle C . This was done by hand with a drill press not the machinery theyhad. Once the holes were drilled, the top pins of the circle were removed in an attempt to make a "U". However,

the results were less than desired. None of the holes were soldered shut. Some were damaged by new drill holes in trying to even out the U.

Years ago, I sent proofs of the complete Circle design and then one of the " $U$ " to show the transition and possible position of each U for those wanting to plate the strip of ten. I sent it to Mr. Louge, the old catalog editor. There is not one pattern that will work for the " U " as each of the ten letters "U" are individual and identifiable design.
