


# PERFORATED TELEGRAPH FORM

In the August '97 (289) Bulletin, I noted in my final article on Perforated Postal Stationery, Telegraph Forms, that the only one I had, and had ever seen, was a QV with perfin A2820.01 (AH/&C<sup>0</sup>). A "WM" (W5160.01) had been seen reported on an unknown date in The Cinderella Philatelist. No one wrote to me at the time to confirm this Telegraph Form.

**JEFF TURNBULL** has now sent a photocopy of an EVII Telegraph Form with G3400.01 (GM/&G) of Ginner Morton & Goddard, perforated through the embossed 6d stamp from his collection. The "5/12" at the bottom of the Form shows the Form was printed in May 1912. The printer is just noted as 'Wy. & S., Ltd.'

These Telegraph Forms must be the scarcest Perforated Postal Stationery items.
