Roberta M. Coltman started collecting perfins because her father couldn't bear to throw them away.

When he found a perfin, he would mount it at the bottom of the page in his collection.

There must have also been a few precancels down there too because Coltman wound up with impressive collections of both.

In the 1980s, she decided to have her own perfin: the RCM monogram shown here. It's in the U.S. catalog as R33.5P.
