
Longman & Martinez Paint Makers (L184 / D+)

In the series of advertising postcards with perfin, another frequently found card is that of the Longman & Martinez Paint Makers. I searched the internet for more information on this company but was only able to discover that they were in business in the early 1890's and at least through the mid 1930's. These dates were discovered only through other philatelic advertising covers and some non-philatelic advertising materials.

Maybe Carter White Lead Paint was so successful, or thought that Longman & Martinez was, that both companies made liberal use of these beautiful post cards with their respective perfins. You will note

that all views are of New York, New York - the location of this company. But, unlike Carter White Lead Paint, not one mention is made that any of these buildings used Longman & Martinez's paints. Note that on the April 28, 1910 card there is a typewritten note (in red) that "...this card is not good if used by anyone else!..." I've never seen that kind of advertising slogan before! You would think that they would want anyone to use their product, wouldn't you!

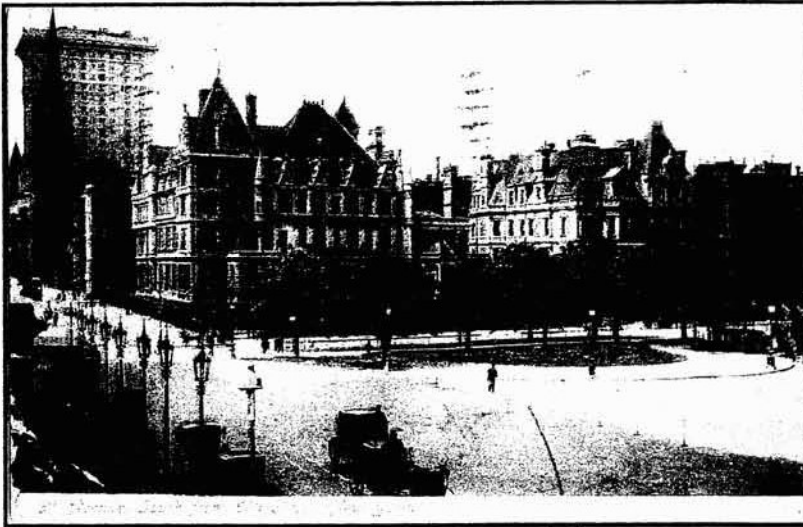
Most notably these views turn back the clock nearly 100 years! It has been a long time since St. Patrick's Cathedral was the largest building in its area!

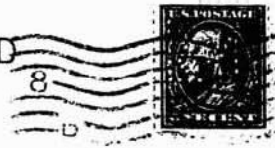
I would certainly appreciate hearing from anyone with other copies of this L&M perfin on postcards.
