

March 2006

Treasurer's Report: Treasurer's Report was accepted and placed on file.

Newsletter Editor: Diane was not present. Linda reminded everyone that the newsletter deadline is the 15th of the month.

Rhode Island State Director's Report: Ron was not present for the RI State Director's report.

The Fencers and Bouchard's will be wagon masters for the June campout at Oak Embers. The July campout at Chamberlin Lake needs wagon masters. The September campout (Mass Fall Frolic in Spencer) needs wagon masters. The November campout at Canoe River needs wagon masters. Kathy gave an update for the Camp-O-Rama. The Beach Committee has not yet had another meeting where we plan to raise some specific issues, such as coming in on Wednesday. Due to some increased costs, camping fees will be increased slightly. Kathy reminded everyone to sign up for duties.

Old Business: Joanne Falkof prepared an Income/Expense report for the last fiscal year ending Oct. 31, 2005, and a projected budget for this fiscal year. COPIES WILL BE AVAILABLE AT MEETINGS. OR, CALL JOANNE FOR A COPY. Discussion on these reports included remarks about costs/fees for Camp-O-Rama. Dues primarily cover newsletter expenses and coffee expenses. Joanne has recently switched banks to Citizen's Bank to avoid bank fees. We are a non-profit and are eligible for a no-fee bank account at Citizen's Bank. Paul recommended that the Board of Directors meet to discuss the Treasurer's reports and make recommendations to the membership. Linda will let Lou know and he'll arrange the meeting.

The club needs a new Historian. Linda Bouchard was the previous Historian. Primarily, the Historian takes pictures for an album to document club activities.

The NAFCA Educational Conference is the first weekend in June. (See the CHATTER for full details.) At the next Quahaug meeting we will consider any recommendations for a scholarship to attend the conference. Also, NAFCA offers scholarships for both couples and teens. Often these scholarships go unused so it would be worthwhile to apply if you're planning to attend the conference.
