

## Secretary's Report

## June 2006

The meeting was called to order with the Pledge of Allegiance and a Moment of Silence.

<u>New Members:</u> Cheryl LeBlanc introduced new members: Paul and Mary Barrett and daughter Dawn; and Michael and Patricia Newton. New members, Ernie and Joanne Babin were not present.

Secretary's Report: The Secretary's Report as printed in the newsletter was accepted and placed on file.

Treasurer's Report: The Treasurer's Report was read, accepted and placed on file.

Sunshine Report: Anne noted that JoAnn Villiard has sustained broken fingers.

Newsletter Editor: Dianne reminded members of the May 15<sup>th</sup> deadline.

<u>NAFCA Delegate's Report:</u> Dale reported that the Spring Safari is all set. 10 quahaug families will be attending and are encouraged to participate in the Parade of Colors.

Rhode Island State Director's Report: Ron (NAFCA Vice President) reported on the recent NAFCA Officers and Directors meeting. Next year is NAFCA's 50<sup>th</sup> anniversary. In July, 07, there will be a "Nifty Fifty" Party. NAFCA is soliciting suggestions for the 2007 Spring Safari. There have been 7 proposals thus far for the 2007 Nafcaree. Read about them in the June issue of CHATTER. Indicate your preferences to your delegate so she will know how to vote when the time comes to make a decision. NAFCA is embarking on a Membership Drive. Any current member who sponsors a new member will get a \$5.00 gift certificate from the Auxiliary, effective from the Spring Safari for one year. <u>President's Report:</u> Lou reported on the 2006 Campouts. He thanked Norma and Sherri and their team for a fine time at the April campout at Canoe River. The Fencers and Bouchards will be hosting the June Oak Embers campout and a "Breakfast at Your Leisure" will be put on for Saturday AM. We are still looking for wagon masters for the September-Fall Mass Frolic in Spencer. Please see campout listings in the newsletter for full details.

Mary Jean, Bev and Sherri offered to Chair the Children's Christmas Party, the first Saturday in December. As always, it will be a full turkey dinner with parents bringing pot luck side dishes. Club children will receive gifts from Santa. Non-club grandchildren may attend, but gifts must be supplied to Santa.

<u>Old Business:</u> Lou reported that the Board of Directors held a meeting to discuss the budget and the Treasurer's reports on annual spending. Cuts were made only to the Camp-O-Rama budget. Lou thanked Chris for coming up with some appropriate cuts. It was a collective effort between the Board and the Camp-O-Rama chairman (Chris).

Linda Bouchard offered to again organize the adult Holiday Party at the Venus de Milo.

The Educational Conference is coming up (see The Chatter). Deadline to register is May 22. All NAFCA scholarships have been awarded. Norma and Linda Bouchard received NAFCA scholarships. For others who may want to attend, the Quahaug's will pay \$25.00 toward the weekend fee for adult members in good standing.

Lou reminded members that there have been issues about teens roaming about and being noisy after 10 PM at campouts. The Club has a rule that all kids must be at their family's site by 10 PM.

Lou encouraged wagon masters to have community fires at campouts to promote club unity.

Chris and Norma gave an update on CAMP-O-RAMA plans, which are progressing well. Everyone will be responsible for their own trash and taking it to the dumpster. There will be no trash barrels. Quahaug members may be at the beach on Wednesday at noon (no earlier). We have 123 reservations, 61 coming in on Thursday. New this year, we need to reserve for the Pancake House run. All bus trips will cost \$1.00 per person, per trip. Members are encouraged to sign up for duties. Chart will be at the next meeting. Thursday evening, there will be a pot luck dinner for members only. Guests can arrive no earlier than noon on Thursday or 10 AM on Friday. Chris encouraged members to arrive on Wednesday (at least drop off rig in assigned parking slot) to make sure your sites are settled and so as to not interfere with guest parking. For the benefit of new members, Chris gave an overview of CAMP-O-Rama. Lou reminded members that this is a WORK WEEKEND.

New Business: Lou asked the members present if they wanted a cookout for the June meeting. It was moved and seconded that a cookout would be held on June 4<sup>th</sup> at 3 PM in the field across the street. Members will bring pot luck. The club will provide hot dogs and hamburgers and buns. Some members offered to bring grills. The regular June meeting will be held immediately following the cookout.
