Secretary's Report

October 2006

The meeting was called to order with the Pledge of Allegiance and a Moment of Silence.

New Members: Cheryl welcomed new members, Shirley and Barry Meehan

Secretary's Report: Report was read, accepted and placed on file.

Treasurer's Report: Report was read, accepted and placed on file.

Sunshine Report: Anne reported that Bob Hall had a stroke and is receiving care at New Hope Hospital.

Newsletter Editor: Diane was not present. Deadline is 15th of the month.

NAFCA Delegate's Report: Dale reported on the recent meeting of the Council of Chapters. Currently, there are 1,079 Nafca members (families). All those who attended the Nafcaree will receive a \$20.00 refund due to NAFCA having a larger balance of receipts than planned. NAFCA then donated \$650 from the Nafcaree toward the NAFCA 50th anniversary celebration. The Conservation Weekend, a work weekend, will be held on the weekend of April 20-22, 2007, at Otter River, Baldwinville. It will be the kickoff for the 50th celebration (NIFTY FIFTY). Camping will be free but be warned there are NO hookups or dump station. The 2007 Spring Safari will be at the Greenfield Fairgrounds. The 2007 NAFCA Education Conference will be June 1-3, at Spencer Fairgrounds. The 2007 Full Board Meeting will be July 13-15 at Mineral Springs, CT. The 2007 Nafcaree will be at Timothy Lake in the Pennsylvania Pocono Mountains. The cost will be \$225.00 for the week plus trip costs. This Nafcaree is expected to sell out early, so do not delay in getting your reservations in. See the Chatter for details. Dale mentioned a NAFCA concern: that some campgrounds, like Bowdish Lake, are charging extra for both dogs and children making camping costs prohibitive for some families. In addition, campgrounds are beginning to eliminate safari fields which hinders camping groups like ourselves and Good Sam. It has been suggested that NAFCA, Good Sam and other camping organizations meet to discuss these concerns and possible solutions.

Rhode Island State Director's Report: Ron, as 1st Vice President, gave the report. Ron gave many details about the 2007 Nafcaree and had a picture display of the campground and activities available. There will be many trip opportunities, such as Philadelphia, NYC, Scranton, a coal mine, West Point, FDR Library, a rafting adventure, plus many more.

Quahaug events: The October 13-15 campout at Hickory Ridge (Corti's and Villiard's) is all planned. Everyone attending is asked to bring a 1000 sheet roll of toilet paper, one for each adult in your family. Camping cost is \$25.00 per night. Betty listed the events: coffee/goodies on Friday night, decorating trailers contest, building scarecrows, crafts for children, pumpkin carving, costume parade, Halloween Party, and pastry contest, all on Saturday. Lunch will be Corn Chowder and dinner will be an Old Fashioned New England Boiled Dinner, cooked by the men. A motion was made, seconded and passed to give the Hickory Ridge hosts an extra \$50.00 from the club treasury to cover the costs of the Halloween party.

The November 17-19 campout at Canoe River, hosted by Dale Irvine, will feature a roast pork, mashed potato dinner plus a Sunday morning breakfast. Cost will be \$27/night.

Mary Jean reported on the Children's Holiday Party, Dec. 3rd at 2 PM. Every family must bring a side dish. She and Shari need a list of member children planning to attend. The Club will be buying gifts for the member's children. Grand-children are invited but grandparents must provide a gift for each grandchild for Santa to give out. Gifts must not exceed a \$15.00 cost. A motion was made, seconded and passed to provide \$600 from the club treasury to cover party costs.

Linda reported that the Adult Holiday Party will be held, Sat., Dec 23rd at the Venus de Milo. It was the only Saturday available. The Costs are \$30.00 per person. (A reminder: the club does not cover ½ the cost as in previous years. The Club voted to cover only half of the Anniversary Party cost.)

Norma reported on the Anniversary Party. Since the RI Winter Social usually planned for February, the club agreed to combine the Anniversary Party with the RI Winter Social. The dates are Feb. 23-25, 2007 at the Newport Inn and Spa, which has an indoor pool and spa, and a restaurant. The Dinner buffet will cost \$36.00 a person. The Club, as voted on, will cover ½ the cost for each member in good standing. Hotel reservations can be made directly with the hotel by calling 401-846-7600 and mentioning NAFCA. NAFCA hotel room costs are \$66.67/night.

Ron mentioned the RI Camping Show on Mar.2-4, 2007 at the RI Convention Center.

Old Business: Kathy Lena reported that the Camporama was a success and thanked the members who worked so hard to make it a success. There were 160 guest families and 35 member families attending. The Camporama committee will be meeting next month with the Beach Commission to set up next year's Camporama.

<u>New Business:</u> Russ Peckham reminded the club that the Nominating Committee needs to be activated. Grant, Mary Ellen and Russ were selected for the committee.

Linda reported that she is firming up the 2007 camping schedule. A motion was made, seconded and passed to plan our July campout in conjunction with the NAFCA Nifty Fifty Celebration at Mineral Springs. Also, Linda reported that we have standing deposit at Peter's Pond for next April. That weekend conflicts with the Conservation Weekend at Otter River. Peter's Pond has been sold and the new owners are charging \$29.00 per night plus \$3.00 a night for each child. Dogs are free. In addition, the Campground wants a firm commitment by the end of March, which means no last minute signups and late cancellations will be charged. These may make Peter's Pond less attractive as a Quahaug campout. After discussion, a motion was made and seconded that IF the \$50.00 deposit can be refunded, the club will make Otter River the April campout. However the motion was tabled to give Linda a chance to check out the options, such as changing the weekend. There were several members who would actually prefer Peter's Pond to Otter River.

Dale announced that NAFCA sent a thank you letter to the club for their help at the 2006 Spring Safari. The letter was placed with the Secretary for filing.

Andrew reported that the Teen Club would be meeting at the next Quahaug meeting in November.

<u>Good of the Order:</u> Paul, as games-master, made a request for the club to purchase a new game called NAFGO, recently invented. (The Instructions will be in the Chatter.) Some members offered to look into building a set for the club rather than purchasing a ready-made set.

Meeting was adjourned at 7:40 PM.
