

16th Challenge Trophy Camporee

Rules and Regulations – Oct 17, 18, 19, / 2014

Please review all rules and regulations prior to arriving for the Camporee.

Medical Forms

Each individual is *required* to complete a current Class 1 medical form in order to participate in the Camporee. Use BSA or Scouts Canada forms as per your country of origin. Blank forms may be obtained from the Scout Servicenter, 474 East Avenue, Rochester 14607, or on the web at www.senecawaterways.org/formslibrary.asp. Forms must include **actual dates of vaccination** and be **signed by the parent/guardian**.

Please keep your Unit's copies in a location at your campsite where they may be found if needed. You do not have to hand in your medical forms at the Camporee.

Clothing and Foot Ware

Bring proper clothing and foot ware for the Camporee. The fall weather can be unpredictable and change quickly. Tell everyone in the unit to bring hiker's boots with them in case it gets cold or wet. In the past, cold wet feet due to wearing running shoes was a big problem. Also bring clothing appropriate for the predicted weather. Be prepared to change if need be.

Fuel Policy

For safety reasons, cans of liquid fuel, or "white gas" are prohibited on the campsites for safety reasons. All stoves and/or lanterns must be filled with white gas, if applicable, prior to arriving at the camp. Store your cans of liquid fuel in your trailer while at the camp and refill if necessary in the parking lot.

Campsite Fire Pots – With Wood Purchased at Camp Babcock Hovey

Fire Pots - Fires are permitted at your campsite providing you supply a "fire pot" to keep the fire off the ground. I.e. No Ground Fires allowed! These can be purchased in most home improvement stores. Safe fire practices as per BSA standards must be followed. Please control sparks and flaming ashes that may float in the air, so tents do not get damaged. **Firewood** – Seneca Waterways Council rules do not allow external firewood to enter SWC Camps. Camp Babcock-Hovey will provide firewood at the Camp for a reasonable price. This is necessary to prevent the invasive insects like the "*Emerald Ash Borer*" from spreading.

Grease Trap Policy

For health and environmental reasons, patrols / troops are encouraged to construct and properly use a grease trap for wastewater. Traps may be constructed by punching holes in the bottom of a small plastic bag and placing a generous amount of dead leaves and grass inside to trap the grease. Grease traps should be disposed of properly at the conclusion of the Camporee. Refer to the enclosed diagram.

Special Needs

Parking

Limited parking space is available. When at all possible, car-pooling is recommended. *Be prepared to **park your vehicles*** as directed by CTC Staff when you arrive at the Camp.

Registration (*Roster Form, Forms #1 and #3*)

Upon arrival, proceed to Pedersen Lodge as noted on the enclosed map. Materials needed for registration includes sign in **Form #1, Form #3 (Yellow)**. The “*Roster Form*” as supplied or downloaded from the website must be filled out in advance. Complete the troop’s sections on the Roster Form, Form #1 and #3 before going to registration. This will save you time during the registration process.

NOTE: - Only the “Yellow form will be returned to you to give to the Sub-camp Staff.

Event Volunteers From Attending Troops

Adults are needed to help run events: All adults (Scouters / parents) and interested senior youth are needed for the event areas. 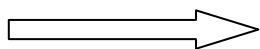
Youth volunteers will be assigned to each subcamp as a “Subcamp Chief.” Each subcamp will also be assigned to an event area, where another youth volunteer will be designated as the “Event Area Coordinator.”

CTC Trading Post

Scoutmaster’s Checklist

- 1) Inform [Dave Cheney \(585-241-8531\)](mailto:dave.cheney@scout.org) of any individuals with special needs.
- 2) Complete Class 1 medical forms for each youth and adult attending the Camporee. Each Unit *keeps* their medial forms with their unit.
- 3) Remit full payment as per Form #1 - Early Bird Payment Form & Pay at the Camp Form. This form will be enclosed with the CTC Leader’s Package when you pre-register.
- 4) Complete Form #1, accounting for all youth and adults attending the Camporee. Upon arrival, bring this form to the registration in Pedersen Lodge on Friday and Saturday morning.
- 5) Scoutmaster should complete Form #3 to be submitted to the Subcamp Chief on Friday night after registration. Complete the Quiz on the back of form #3 “pre-camporee” and your troop will receive credit for that event on the event card.

A **Camporee schedule and map** are included in this Leader’s Package and are also on the CTC Website. Copies should be made for all patrols, adults and leaders. Activities will begin on Friday night and will continue unannounced. Please be prompt and aware of the times and locations of each event. Note the Chariot Race schedule on the bottom RHS of the CTC schedule.
