Civil Air Patrol Grades, Abbreviations, etc.

Grade: Abbreviation: "Term of Address"

Colonel: Col: "Colonel"

Lieutenant Colonel: Lt Col: "Colonel"

Major: Maj: "Major" Captain: Capt: "Captain"

First Lieutenant: 1st Lt: "Lieutenant"

Second Lieutenant: 2d Lt: "Lieutenant" (Note: It is not 2nd Lt)

Chief Master Sergeant: CMSgt: "Chief" Senior Master Sergeant: SMSgt: "Sergeant"

Master Sergeant: MSgt: "Sergeant" Technical Sergeant: TSgt: "Sergeant" Staff Sergeant: SSgt: "Sergeant" Senior Airman: SrA: "Cadet" Airman First Class: A1C: "Cadet"

Airman: Amn: "Cadet" Airman Basic: AB: "Cadet"

Please note for all NCO grades (Staff Sergeant through Chief Master Sergeant) you can also use the grade itself as a term of address:

Chief Master Sergeant: CMSgt: Chief or Chief Master Sergeant

Staff Sergeant: SSgt: Sergeant or Staff Sergeant

For **all** cadets, your grade is preceded by "cadet". Also your abbreviation is preceded by "C/".

Finally, you are **not** addressed as "Cadet + term of address":

Cadet Major: C/Maj: "Major" (not Cadet Major)

Cadet Chief Master Sergeant: C/CMSgt: "Chief" (not Cadet Chief)

Cadet Senior Airman: C/SrA: "Cadet" (not Cadet Cadet)

Next topic is Signature elements: This is used when signing your name to a letter (whether it be military style or business), an email, a publication, or manual. You can review CAPR 10-1, but below is a condensation of it.

The correct signature element *should* be 2-line. That is it should only have two lines. Show your name in capital letters, grade in upper/lower case, and then the service abbreviation in capitals. Your duty title is shown on the second line in upper/lower case:

(NAME), Captain, CAP Commander

There are two exceptions that allow a 3-line signature element. One exception is where if the document's heading did not include your organization's name. Then the element should be:

(NAME), Captain, CAP Commander (School) Cadet Squadron

The other exception is that only the National Commander and the CAP Executive Director have a standard 3-line signature element:

AMY S. COURTER Major General, CAP National Commander
