### Happy Holidays from the President!

This has been a year full of ups and downs. More than the usual amount of our rescues passed away due to illness or injury, animal cruelty calls have increased and we are constantly struggling to help as many animals as we possibly can. It can be quite an emotional rollercoaster. When people hear stories of animal cruelty or see some of our sick dogs and cats, they often ask, "How do you do handle all the sadness and deal with the stress of the shelter?" Well, I've learned that so many times you just have to hang in there and "focus on the positive." (That became my mantra when my father was so ill for a few years.)

So often it seems that when things aren't going so well, all of the sudden they turn around. I see hope and encouragement in our animals: McFadden, who was hit by a car and had also been shot. He lost a leg and an eye, but was adopted the second time he went to adoption day! Burky, who was hit by a car, couldn't stand when we first got him. He has a terrible heart defect but bounced back and shares a yard with Diamond, who loves to stand on her doghouse. I saw Burky attempt several times to join her on a doghouse, but just couldn't figure it out. The day I saw him jump high enough to sit next to her on a doghouse, I couldn't stop smiling. Dickens, who weighed about two pounds when we got him, had a terrible case of mange and had a mangled leg that had to be amputated. He is definitely a "Little Dickens" now because he is a holy terror on three legs. He runs so fast, so we often joke how crazy he would be on four legs. Chesney, who was used for dog fighting and was half dead when we rescued her. She survived heartworm treatment and her wounds healed. She now jumps and plays with a lot of energy and happiness.

But what has kept me going the most this year is the amazing amount of support we have received from people like you. This year, so many people and businesses have approached us to inquire how they could support us. It is so heartwarming to see that more people than ever realize how great the need is to help our sweet four-legged companions. I'm not referring to donations as the only example of support. Sometimes people send kind notes or stop us just to thank us for what we do. Many businesses have let us put donation canisters on their counter and post flyers for special events. All of us are very grateful to our wonderful supporters, and we could not continue our work without you. Ronnie is a blind cattle dog mix that we rescued last year. The litter was literally starving, surviving on corn in the field. We found homes for all of them but Ronnie was the last one left... until his perfect family came along. They saw something special in this goofy guy and he has turned into a wonderful addition to their family.

Not too long ago Ronnie's new mom brought him back to visit us and it literally brought tears to our eyes. He is huge, gorgeous and just as goofy as he was when he was a puppy!

But the amazing part of the visit wasn't Ronnie... it was the love that his new mom so obviously had for him and the wonderful stories she had to tell us.

Evidently our dear puppy Ronnie was quite the

handful. But his new mom said "It's okay, he's blind!"

We proceeded to hear about all of the trials and tribulations Ronnie had put them through, from chewing everything imaginable to taking over 6 months to housetrain and more, but all of her stories were said with a smile and the famous line



"It's okay, he's blind! And he is the perfect dog!"

Now Ronnie being blind actually had nothing to do with the lil monster being forgiven for his multitudes of sins. His new parents loved him in spite of them and embraced his disability and his stubbornness. They chose to love him unconditionally, even when he pretends that he is deaf and can't hear them even those he is only blind!

So many times FCAR receives a call from an adopter wanting to return an animal and it is our policy to accept the animal back unconditionally. However, it is incredibly frustrating to hear the minor issues or excuses that people use to justify returning their pet. We can only hope to find more parents like Ronnie's, ones that are willing to provide a lifelong home for one of our special animals.

#### Animal Cruelty

There is a family that we have repeatedly investigated for animal cruelty. They had numerous dogs and left them all chained to different trees around their yard without food or clean water. One dog was very sick with mange, and they would not take him to a vet. Instead, they followed an old wives tale; they dipped the dog in burnt motor oil. This does not cure mange!

Another dog was always too thin. They would occasionally remedy the problems and comply with our orders, but after awhile it became apparent that they would not take proper care of their pets. We eventually seized

the dogs that needed medical attention and charged the owners with animal cruelty. The son, who was the primary caretaker of the dogs, was found guilty and sentenced to probation for a year and ordered not to own any more animals.

Animal cruelty investigations are a big part of what FCAR does to protect animals. We are kept very busy going on calls to investigate, which we receive almost daily. We have had already won some convictions this year, and we still have two upcoming cases. One case involves neglect and one involves dog fighting. We are optimistic that both parties will be found guilty.

#### Volunteer Spotlight - Connie Shaw

Connie Shaw has been a volunteer at FCAR... well, for as long as any of us can remember. And she is one great volunteer. She offers to go to every event and always says, "Just tell me what you need me to do." She always has a positive attitude and is always willing to drive our big van full of animals to our events. And not only is she willing to drive it... she enjoys it! You should see her cheery notes about getting to spend time with the dogs! Connie is a HUGE Memphis Tiger fan,

and home games are the only thing that keeps her from adoption day. Yet, if the Tigers are playing out of town, she'll come to an adoption day but she will wear her headphones so she can listen to the game! Now, that's loyalty to both FCAR and the Tigers. #### Dog Woods Makes a Difference!

For almost 2 years now, Dog Woods Training Center has supported FCAR by providing on site obedience training, free of charge, for some of our rescues. They keep an animal for 6-8 weeks, working on basic obedience as well as on any behavior issues the dog may have. Once the training is complete, they provide the person who adopts the animal with a free 8-week obedience class. In addition, Dog Woods allows us to participate in weekly obedience classes with rescues that are currently in foster care.

This program has been a tremendous success for FCAR. The partnership

with Dog Woods has allowed us to address potential behavior issues with some of our animals that were preventing their adoption. In many cases, they have created an extra selling point for our hard to place animals, especially our black dogs. Some of our recent Dog Woods graduates that have been adopted include Ms. Piggy, Valerie and Cinderella.

#### FCAR Success Story - Maize

After I graduated college, I had always said that I wanted a dog. I have volunteered with FCAR and realized that a shelter dog is the best dog to have. When I first met forever dog Maize, she was staying at my friend's house as a foster dog. I was a bit nervous because I was told that she was a pit bull mix. I sat outside with all the dogs and she was the one who came up to me and licked my hand. I sat down on the concrete and petted her as she put her head on my shoulder. That night as I was leaving my friends house, she tried to follow me out the door. At that point she had won my heart. I asked about her history and found out that someone had let a choke chain grow into her neck (she still has the scar), and tried to cut off her tail.

I decided to research information regarding pit bulls. Did you know it is reported on temperament tests conducted by the American Temperament Test Society that Pit Bulls had a passing rate of 82% or better -- compared to only 77% of the general dog population? One of the most amazing things about this breed is their ability to adapt to almost any situation. They serve in a wide variety of professional fields as well as making outstanding companions. Their attitude, courage, and never say die approach to life makes them exceptional dogs for such fields as search and rescue, therapy dogs, guide dogs, and police and military drug and bomb sniffers. Several different sites I researched also stated they are wonderful family dogs, most of them make poor guard dogs because they do not know a stranger.

All in all, I learned it was the lack of education and knowledge that gives the pit bull a bad rap. It is the people who want them to do bad things are the only ones shown on the news. It is my duty as a responsible pit bull owner to help people understand that it is not the dog that is bad, but the people who are mistreating the dog.



It didn't take long for Maize to figure out that if she did tricks, she would get treats. I took her to Shelby Farms for the first time (on a leash) she looked at me like, "Are you going to let me go play or what?" Soon she was playing with the other dogs and wore herself out. When she was done, she came to my side and waited until it was time to go. Maize has also been known to be an escape artist - she jumped over one of my friend's fences. I didn't believe it until I saw it myself. I heard she did that at the shelter too and she was known as "Spiderwoman". She had been at the shelter for over a year and was the unofficial mascot.

Now Maize has no fear being around other dogs or people. My three and five year old nephew's adore her and she adores them. The youngest will just stand there and she will just kiss on him until he stops laughing. She loves to jump in the car and go for a ride no matter where we go. I love all her different smiles, the way she will curl up with me on the bed, and she doesn't care where I go as long as she is invited. She loves playing with her bones and being silly. One of my favorites is when she goes to sleep; she will roll over and fall to the floor. I finally just put pillows down so it wouldn't hurt as much.

I now have a personal affinity for Pit Bulls and will do whatever I can to educate people on how loyal, intelligent and silly they are, and that they can be the best friend any human can have.


