## Angels at Work

Due to the nature of the rescue work that we do, focusing on abused and neglected animals, we frequently get in animals that may not initially be considered "overly adoptable". Usually that means that they have special needs, have not been socialized or their experiences with people to date have been so traumatic that they have a very difficult time trusting a new family. We are so grateful to all of those special angels that are willing to adopt one of our special needs animals.



In 2007 we received a call about a dog that had a severe burn along his back. Although the burn healed quickly the scar required the application of sunscreen every day to avoid sunburn. Darrin then developed skin lesions that after a lengthy diagnosis were finally treatable by weekly shots that he would have to be given for life. Add to that he is a pitbull, so now we have a scarred pitbull that requires weekly medicine. Talk about hard to place! But two of our wonderful volunteers fell in love with Darrin and told their friends about him who offered to foster him. We were absolutely thrilled when they decided to adopt this special dog!

In Spring of 2008 we were notified about a dog that had been abandoned by her owner and then shot. After several attempts we were finally able to catch her and treat her for her injuries and mange. Unfortunately she was terrified of people and even after being placed in a foster home we were concerned that she would never be adopted. But the most amazing family (who had previously adopted from us) fell in love with Koko and what a fairytale ending for this girl. She is now in her own loving home where she gets to play all day with her canine and human family! What a great ending!





In February 2009 a wonderful lady adopted Mac, a 9 year old hound mix. We had him for so long we were overwhelmed that she would give this sweet boy a forever home. Well she contacted us again this summer and wanted a companion for Mac. And what goes better with a big Mac than Pickles?! Mac & Pickles had been best buddies at the shelter and even though Pickles was a very shy dog that we had for almost 3 years, this wonderful angel adopted her and now these two buddies are living the high life in their forever home. It doesn't get better than this!

## Sweet Charlene

About 5 years ago Gina kept noticing beagle hobbling along Raleigh LaGrange as she drove to the shelter. She would hold up one of her hind legs, but she could still get around very well. Sometimes she would be lying in a yard with 2 other dogs so we assumed that was her home. We became concerned though, because her leg wasn't getting any better so Gina stopped by the house and spoke to the lady who lived there. She said Charlene wasn't hers; she just came by one day and decided to hang out with her other dogs. Knowing that needed hurt and Charlene was veterinary care, we decided to rescue Charlene so we could get her leg fixed and find her a home. Easier said than done!

The next day Gina stopped by the house, all prepared to catch her, but she kept outrunning her, even on three legs! She kept ducking into bushes and ditches where she couldn't follow so we ended up having to set a humane trap to catch her. She was named Charlene, but nicknamed "Old Momma" because she was old and had obviously had a lot of litters.

Charlene was heartworm positive and had cancer in her mammary glands. She lost some teeth, too, but that only made her cuter because it caused her tongue to hang out of her mouth. She was quite the trooper because none of these medical problems ever slowed her down. Charlene was very old, but had a lot of energy. We often said, "She had more energy than the puppies." She even had a boyfriend, another old beagle named Stanley. She loved him and followed him everywhere.

When Stanley passed away a couple of years ago we put Charlene with other dogs to play with inside the shelter. The only problem was that they kept getting adopted and Charlene kept getting a new roommate. After the fourth friend got adopted leaving Charlene by herself again, Laurie decided to take the old girl home with her to foster so that she could live out her golden years in an actual home. And did she ever live them to the fullest!

She blended right into the herd of dogs at Laurie's house where she loved

to run outside for hours and spent her day checking the yard for squirrels and sunning herself on the deck, Charlene was full of life and there is nothing like seeing her famous Charlene waddle as she ran full blast from the far part of the yard. The old girl could move!

In February 2008 Charlene got glaucoma in her left eye and had to have her eye removed. But the old girl was back to normal immediately! Even with cancer, one eye, no teeth, deaf and being bitten by a copperhead, Charlene was always happy and fun. Have you ever tried to get the attention of a one eyed, deaf dog running on 2 acres? At first we were able to blow a goose call to get her attention but then we had to resort to flashing a spotlight on her while waving our arms or finding her and touching her to get her to come inside. Made for some amusing evenings...

The best Charlene story was when Laurie's mother triplet nieces and (Grandma) came to visit one summer from Every day we would each California. choose a dog and head out for our evening walk. As we were selecting dogs we needed a calm dog for Grandma to walk and she asked about Charlene. generally never took her on a walk simply because of her age and the distance we go but Charlene was the perfect choice for Grandma. About a third of the way around we noticed Grandma had slowed some so we turn around to check on the two old girls. And what we saw gave us a laugh we still talk about... Grandma was carrying Charlene in her arms! We asked her what in the world was she doing and she told us that Charlene had gotten tired so she decided to carry her to give her a rest. It was priceless.

Charlene spent the last years of her life running around a big yard, enjoying the sunshine, playing with dogs and snuggling in dog beds. She was 17 ½ years old when glaucoma got to her other eye and we had put her down in September 2009. I have fostered dozens and dozens of dogs, from the most severely injured to unsocialized ones that have been abused and beaten, but I don't know of any that gave me so much internal satisfaction and joy as I have gotten from giving Charlene a real home to live out her life.

Rest in peace "Weenie", may heaven be full of all the treasures that you enjoyed here on earth.

#### Man Arrested for Fourth Time for Animal Cruelty

Lotta "Laddie" Lewis was once again arrested for animal cruelty and for two counts of probation violation, just 6 months after being convicted of animal cruelty for the third time. He was first arrested and found guilty in 2000, then 2003, and most recently in March of this year. Fayette County Animal Rescue has taken in over 50 animals from Mr. Lewis in the past 9 years and spent between \$10,000-\$15,000 rehabilitating them. Fortunately, we have found forever homes for all of them however their recovery was, in many cases, a long and difficult ordeal.

In October 2008 we seized 3 horses, 3 kittens and 8 dogs from Mr. Lewis. The horses were underweight and did not have access to fresh water and food. The dogs were sickly and living in deplorable conditions. The kittens were living in a filthy rabbit hutch with no air circulation and were given bread to eat. We also found 4 dead horses on his property. In March 2009, Mr. Lewis pled guilty and was given 8 years probation. He was also ordered to pay restitution to Fayette County Animal Rescue in the amount of \$4,000. To date we have received zero from Mr. Lewis. In addition, he was not allowed to own animals for the length of his probation.

For some reason, Mr. Lewis did not follow the terms of his probation. We recently discovered that he owns several horses, all of which are underweight. They were living in 2 pastures with no grass, just dirt and weeds. There was a filthy pond available in one pasture, and dirty water in barrels and troughs in the other. The barrels and troughs were green with algae and barely had any water in them. But worst of all, the horses were very skinny, with rib bones showing and hip bones protruding. When I spoke to Mr. Lewis I asked him if he noticed the bones showing on the horses, and he said no.

I also checked one of Mr. Lewis' properties (he has multiple properties) to see if there were animals there. I found a dog in a kennel in the backyard. Therefore, Mr. Lewis was arrested for two counts of violation of probation (for possessing animals) and for animal cruelty because of the conditions of the horses. He was in court twice so far however both hearings were continued. He'll be back in court October 12<sup>th</sup> to face the animal cruelty charges and October 30<sup>th</sup> to face the violation of probation charges.

I sincerely hope that Mr. Lewis receives a strict enough punishment this time so that he will learn his lesson and never abuse animals again. However, based on results to date, I am not overly hopeful this will occur...

## A Happy Ending...

Yes, I adopted her. I have had her for about 2 years now and she has finally learned how to go outside and run and play. It means so much when you see such an abused animal overcome what has



happened to them and now know what it is like to be a happy loved pet. She now even gives kisses.

My little girls name is Shylo (because she was so shy and scared). She gets along great with my other 3 rescues. Rescue Pets are the best, I encourage everyone who is looking to get a pet to please adopt a shelter animal it will change your life and bring so much joy to you and your pet.

#### What FCAR Needs...

One question that we hear consistently from supporters and volunteers is "What can I do to help?" And we love that question because the answers are infinite! The amount of work and effort that goes into keeping FCAR running on a daily basis is immense, and truth be told at times overwhelming, but we realize that so much of the work is done in the background and it isn't always apparent what you can do to help. Below is just a very short list of things that you can do to help. But if you don't see something that you can assist with don't worry, the total list is very, very long so just contact us to discuss other opportunities!

- Event Planning We have great success at adopting out animals and raising money at the large events we host throughout the year. The planning for those events can be time consuming and requires good organizational skills and a can do attitude. If you can help plan just one large event a year (Bike race, 5K race, Adoption Festival, etc.) we would consider you an angel!
- Shelter Work Crew A huge need for us is for strong and skilled people to help maintain the actual shelter facility. Whether it is fixing fences, installing doggy doors or trimming trees, our handyman list is never ending. If we could get a few people to help just 4 hours a month we could better maintain and improve our facility for the animals.
- Shelter Secretary The paperwork and phone calls can bury us alive sometimes and what we wouldn't give for someone to volunteer consistently a couple days a week to dig us out! You set the days/hours you can help; we'll show you what to do. Writing letters, returning phone calls, preparing mailings, the list is endless. No previous experience required!
- Animal Socialization There is no more gratifying experience than spending time with the animals at the shelter. We have a beautiful no kill facility, filled with animals that just want to be petted and loved on by anyone willing to spend the time with them. We know there is the false perception that it would be too sad to spend time with the animals but we have had great success with socialization by volunteers making animals more adoptable so that they can find their new forever home

Fundraising, humane education, community advocate, animal taxi driver, the list goes on and on! Just a few hours of your time, even just once a year, can make a difference for the animals. 
