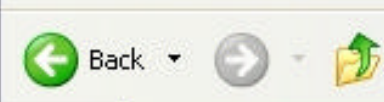

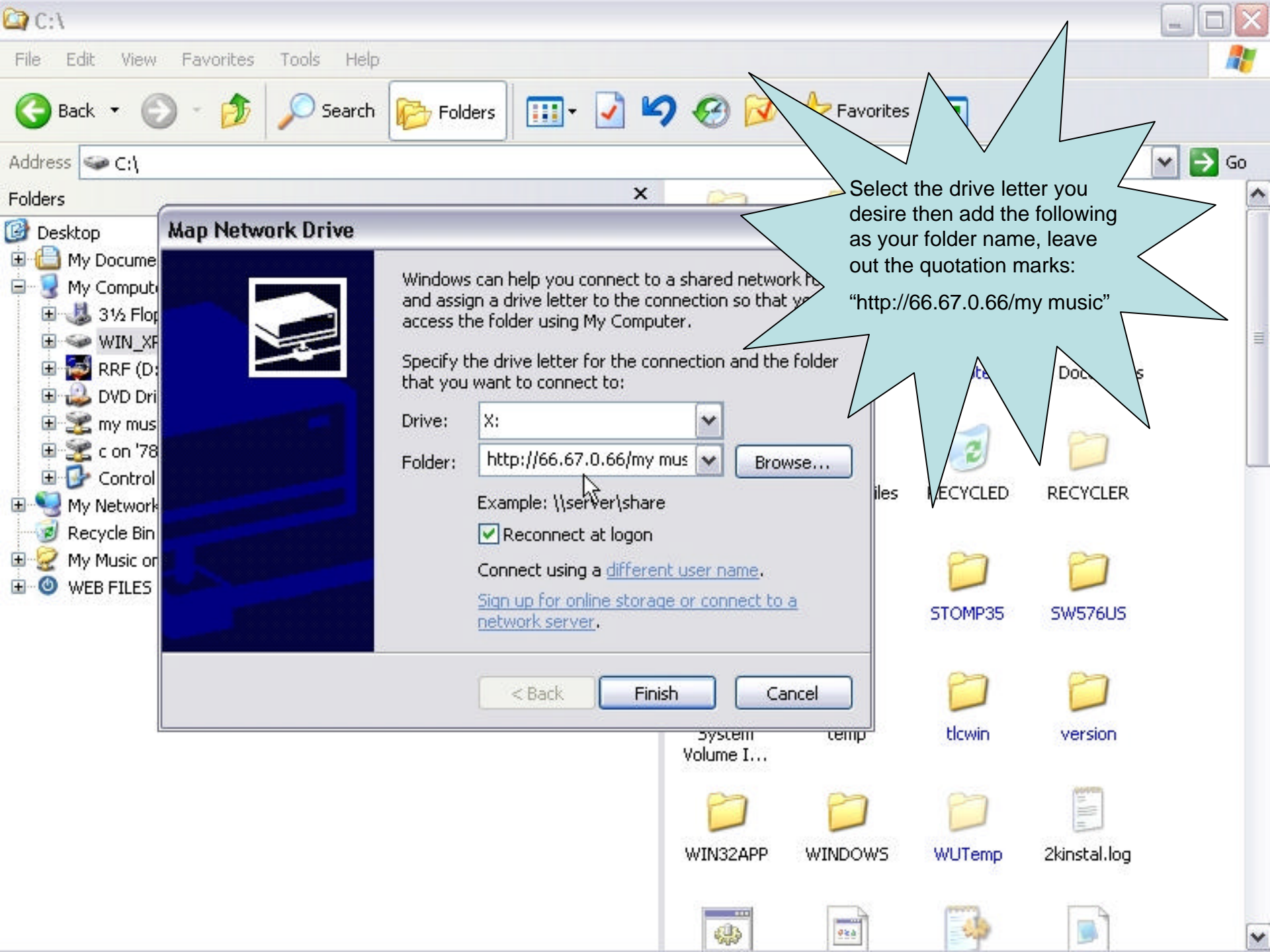

### Map Network Drive

Windows can help you connect to a shared network folder and assign a drive letter to the connection so that you can access the folder using My Computer.

Specify the drive letter for the connection and the folder that you want to connect to:

Drive: X:

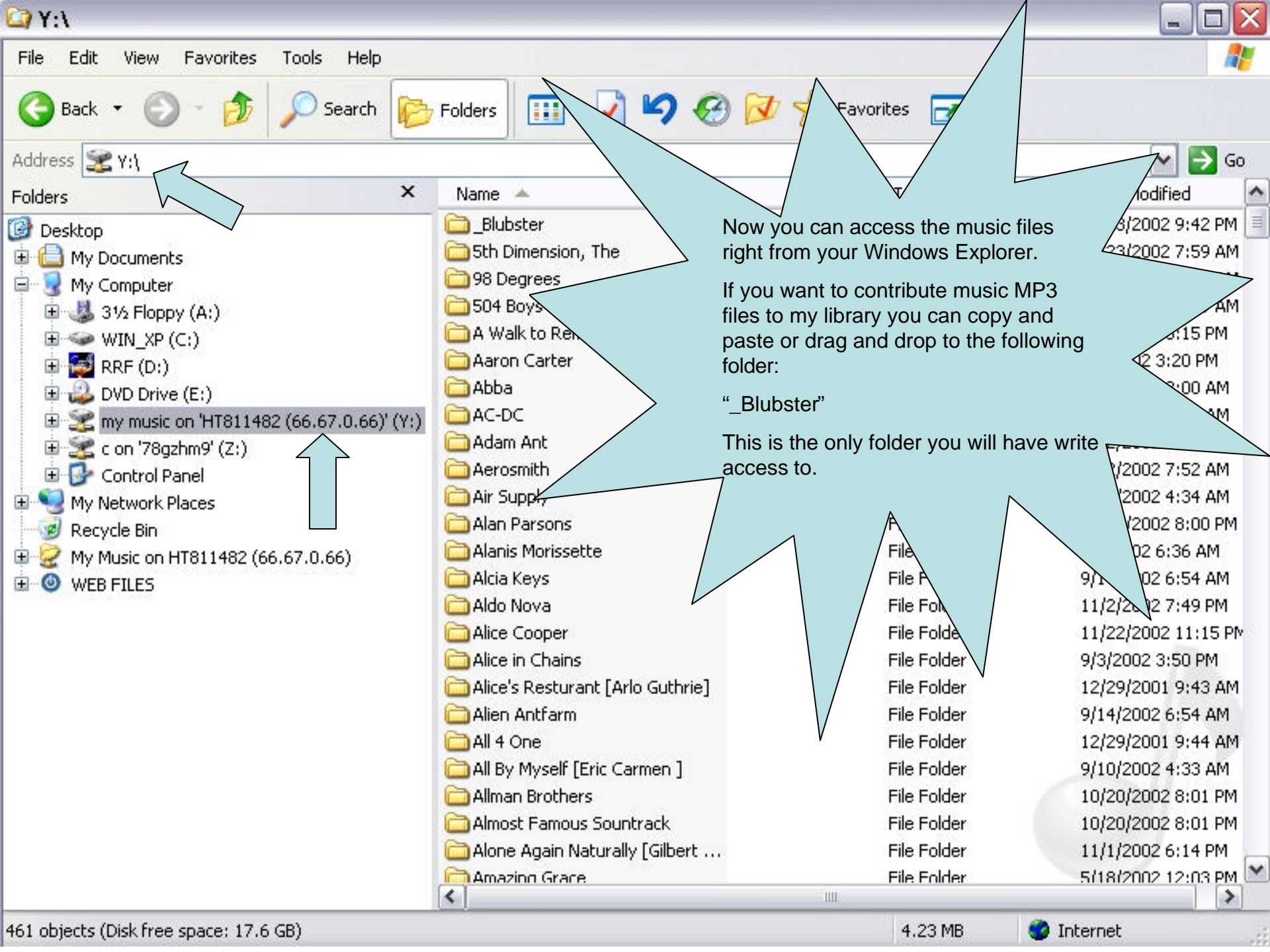

Select the drive letter you desire then add the following as your folder name, leave out the quotation marks:

"http://66.67.0.66/my music"



Now you can access the music files right from your Windows Explorer.

If you want to contribute music MP3 files to my library you can copy and paste or drag and drop to the following folder:

“\_Blubster”

This is the only folder you will have write access to.
