Thought St. Frances Xavier Cabrini earned her sainthood in the USA, she was born in Lombardy, north of Italy in 1850. Though frail from birth she professed vows and founded the Missionary Sisters of the Sacred Heart. Her superior sent her to the USA in 1877 where she started many schools, orphanages, and hospitals. Mother Cabrini was canonized in 1946. After death, some body parts were exhumed and are displayed as part of a mannequin at a shrine in north Manhattan. N.Y., and other places. •


The Vocation Awareness
