Activities at the Carving Center

First, we would like to help Woodcraft sponsor a comprehensive multi-day beginning carvers class akin to what was held at the County schools a number of years ago. This would be taught by NVC carvers and aim at raw beginners who are likely not members of NVC. Costs would be comparable to other Woodcraft courses. Second, we would like to
