## 4. Guest Speakers and Public Discussions.

- **4.a. Dean McLean, Conservation Officer/ Human-Wildlife Conflict Specialist,** spoke on the Grizzley Bear Conservation Plan. His department is setting up bear workshops in other Southern Lakes communities and is willing to have one in Marsh Lake. McLean spoke on Bear Aware education and the need for property owners to remove attractants. Council thanked McLean for attending the meeting.
- **4.b. AYC President Ted Laking** attended and talked about communication between members and government. The AYC AGM will be in May 10 & 11 in Dawson City. Council thanked Laking for attending the meeting.
- 4.c. Report on Doehle Drive and Judas Creek Drive tree clearing public meeting.

Discussion centred around the amount of clearing along the access roads to Judas Creek subdivision was reviewed and a vote was taken, with the majority voting for the 5 meter clear cut on either side of the road and select trees to be removed for line of sight. The vote stood at 19 to 11. There is concern over falling trees during wildfire that will need to be addressed in the future.

Streicker reported on the new Animal Welfare Act and dog control. Public education and responsibilities include care for and control of dogs.
