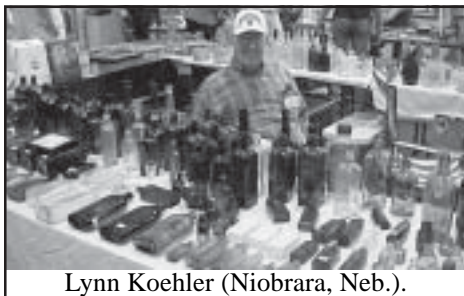
**From Richard Carr,
